

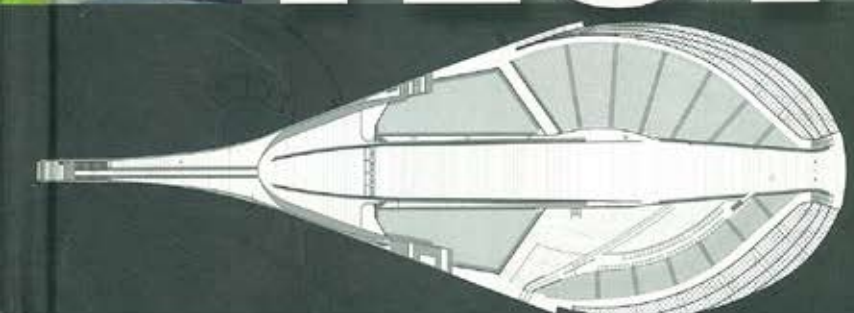

The design required five to six classrooms with a capacity for 30 children. The client wanted the character of a kindergarten school with the use of pastel shades. The two-story building was placed at the middle of the site, so all rooms have natural ventilation. The plan was kept as simple as possible and only had one corridor connecting all the spaces. The hexagonal shape of the building encloses an open courtyard, that acts as a secured playground. The building elevation derives from basic forms of circle, triangle and square and is intended to look modern instead of an old castle or fairy tale exterior. The selection of colors used outside and inside the building avoided dark or bright colors like red, green or orange.
